We completed the first annual Kentucky Perimeter Ride over the Memorial Day weekend with 1271 miles ridden, and lot of laughs, and friendships made. Funny thing was, it was hot and dry then also. Western Kentucky was very dry with crops not growing and ponds drying up. As we came back to the eastern side of the state, we had more shade, greener grass and the creeks were running hard. The most common thing that was visible was everyone's use of riding gear. Helmets, jackets or long sleeve shirts, over the ankle footwear, and other high visibility clothing were worn by all. The Kentucky State Police held their Motorcycle Awareness event this past weekend at the KSP Headquarters in Frankfort. A lot of good information was given out, and I gave away a lot of rider education materials. Where else could you enjoy a nice country ride and get to legally blow through the stop signs and red lights. Thank you KSP!!!! We had a good time!!

As for my final tidbit of information, please, please, please always remember to wear you safety equipment. On Thursday June 14th, Jim Hall (the past International Director of Motorist Awareness for the GWRRA) and his riding companions were headed to West Virginia for their convention. Just past Mount Sterling, KY Jim called to his friends to look right and move right from the left lane. For some reason, reports are that Jim slumped over like he was unconscious and drifted into the left median at about 65 to 70 MPH. Jim was pulling a trailer and struck a deer carcass which he survived. Then, as fate would have it, right in front of him was a concrete culvert. Jim did not get past the culvert. Jim was thrown about 200 feet in the air landing face first in the median. His bike was all but trashed. Jim was taken to the local hospital and then transported to the UKMC. We all know that in most cases, that type of crash would result on a fatality. But Jim's motto has been and always will be "All the gear, all the time"!! Jim was wearing his modular helmet, Kevlar jacket and pants, and over the ankle riding boots. The only visible mark on Jim was to his left cheek and nose where the helmet shattered, and I do mean shattered on impact. After a couple of surgeries and some rehab, Jim got to go home to Clarksville, TN this past weekend. Our prayers and thoughts go with them!


