Keep Those Emotions Under Control

I have been watching a cable TV program that deals with the examination of airplane disasters. When they replay the cockpit recordings of the communication between pilot, co-pilot and the tower; I'm amazed at the calm demeanor and speech patterns. These people must have ice water in their veins. They have to because they have hundreds of lives at stake and they must have total concentration on trying to correct a dangerous scenario. Of course there are examples of distracted piloting like the accident at Blue Grass Field in Lexington when that plane tried to take off on the wrong runway.

Similar situations that are as dangerous can also develop for us motorcyclists when we ride emotionally distressed. According to the therapist there are seven <u>"basic"</u> emotions.

Anger from being cut off by another motor vehicle

<u>Contempt</u> from being stuck in slow moving traffic or behind a slow moving vehicle on a two lane country with no room to pass

Fear that is produced by a sharp curve that you took a little too fast

Disgust produced by erratic riding behavior of a member in a group ride

Happiness that is produced from just riding on a beautiful day

Sadness from the death of a family or chapter member

Surprise like when you see road debris at the apex of a blind curve you are trying to negotiate

<u>Anxious/Hurried</u> when you are driving too fast because you're late for an event or trying to catch up on a group ride because you got separated

When we are overpowered by our emotions our reaction time is diminished, our ability to S-E-E (Search – Evaluate – Execute) dangerous situations is reduced, we take unnecessary high risks, our level of riding skills are impaired and finally we have a disconnection from our riding environment.


When emotionally charged events develop while on a ride; take a break, decompress and regain a more balanced state of mind. After recovering a calmer state; then get back on the road and continue your ride.

The bottom line is that safe riding demands that a rider be much like the airline pilots; focused and calm on the job at hand even in situations that does not have good odds of making it.


