"Bubble of Awareness"

You've seen them on the roads driving their cars, trucks, and SUV's.......they are talking on their phone, eating, making a grocery list, checking their text messages, reading their GPS, fussing at their little ones in the back seat, putting on their makeup......or perhaps all of the above!!! How much of their attention is left for driving responsibly??? This is called the "bubble of awareness" or just how much of an area are they aware of and paying attention to? Perhaps they are aware only up to their front bumper or perhaps their "bubble" includes the car in front of them but not what's behind or beside them. Are we included in these drivers "bubble of awareness"???

How about us as motorcycle riders??? How encompassing is our "bubble of awareness"? We have distractions too such as two way radios, incoming bugs, watching other riders in our group, weather conditions, wind, flying debris and the list goes on· How much of our attention is truly on riding?

Research shows that in an emergency situation, we have 2-3 seconds to react to that situation. The problem is that it takes about 3 seconds to make a judgement on the situation and another couple of seconds to take action based on the aforementioned judgement. You don't have to be a rocket scientist to know that we have a serious time discrepancy here. The difference lies with that 5-10 seconds of awareness that occurs before the emergency situation occurs. If we can extend our "bubble of awareness" about 20 seconds ahead, we can actually start making predictions on our environment and take action to reduce our risk of emergency situations.

Listed are some of examples of predicting emergency situations based on current knowledge:

If there is a truck or tractor with an uncovered load in front of you - predict that there may be debris coming your way. Be prepared to swerve, slow down, or stop.

If the driver ahead of you is driving slowly or moving side to side – predict that perhaps he is lost, looking for an address, or not driving with a logical train of thought – predict that he may turn suddenly and back off. Do not pass as he may take an unexpected left turn.

When there is a curve in the road in sight – predict that beyond the curve there may be a stalled car in the road or perhaps an animal. Take a tighter turn and slow down so you can see further around the curve.

There are many more points of awareness that a rider can take to insure a safer ride. The trick is for us to get our eyes up and look well ahead, identify those potential hazards, make predictions based on that knowledge, and take action early. Enjoy the summer rides, be alert and ride within your limits and most importantly maximize and extend your "bubble of awareness"!




