Riding in Bad Weather

Riding a motorcycle in inclement weather can pose a challenge for even experienced riders. Take it easy on your brakes and throttle and always complete turns before accelerating. It's imperative to avoid sudden movements because your tires won't be able to grip the road as they usually do. When making a turn, slow down beforehand instead of braking for corners. In addition, reduce your risk of skidding by using engine braking for junctions and corners. Engine braking is letting go of the clutch and allowing the engines RPM to drop so you slow down naturally.

When it starts to rain, it's safest to align your bike with tire tracks left by cars. The tire tracks are likely to be less slick than the center of the road. If your rear wheels lock you run the risk of losing control of your bike. If you lock up, release the rear brake and immediately reapply it (repeat if needed) in order to make your stopping distance as short as possible on a slippery surface. If other vehicles are in front of you, be sure to maintain a distance of a few car lengths ahead to allow for more reaction time in these changing conditions.

In inclement weather always wear brightly colored clothing and reflection gear. Also use orange or yellow fog lights. Trigger your brake lights frequently to help other drivers be able to see your motorcycle. Use your low beam headlight when it's difficult to see through the mist. Maintain your distance and speed because you will need to increase your reaction time when braking. Always avoid sudden stops and use engine braking as often as possible. Let the tail lights of the car ahead of you help you navigate. Although these tail lights can be helpful, don't rely too heavily on them as it can give you a false sense of security. Your dependence on another driver to show you the way can spell trouble very quickly - just use other drivers as a point of reference on the road.

Often in bad weather we are inclined to go faster so we can reach our destination as soon as possible. If the weather is bad and your vision is compromised please go slowly and take all precautions so you will reach your destination safely!!! It is imperative to ride safely regardless of the weather conditions but inclement weather presents challenges requiring added concentration and caution.

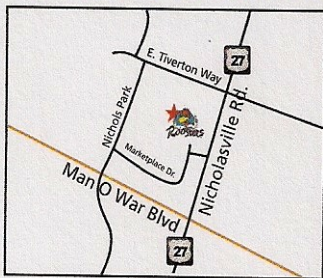

Hello Fellow Wingers,

October rolled in while we were sleeping, can you believe the year is $\frac{3}{4}$ of the way over. Heading into the fall riding season brings some challenges for bike riders in the form of an early setting sun and darkness rolling in earlier. Some bike riders are afraid to ride after dark. I can understand this as it makes it more difficult to see what road conditions you have ahead of you and also the approaching headlights can glare in your eyes and make it difficult to see at all. I read an article a couple of years ago written by Wes Siler who gave some very good advice on the Dangers of Darkness. I'll try to cover some of the advice he gives but in a shorter version

Increase your vision-by making sure your headlights are properly adjusted so they shine approx. 50 to 80 yards down the road on low beam. Sounds obvious but make sure your headlight lens is clean and free of moisture. If you still have stock bulbs you could look into upgrading to either HID or LED bulbs. Its best to have a dealer install any light upgrades, as they better understand the focus of the bulb and the headlight lens. You don't just want bright but you need the beam focused on the road surface.

Address the Dangers – If a car is coming at you on a dark road with its high beam on then focus on the white line on the right side of the road to avoid looking into the light beams. You can use the headlight beams of the car in front of you to look further ahead on the road. Another danger to be aware of is drunk drivers on the road . If you are riding after the local bars close then be extra careful for cars driving in unpredictable manners and give them plenty of room. Be especially careful at red lights, stop signs and at intersections, where impaired drivers are known to speed thru without stopping. Flash your brake lights while stopped, keep your bike in gear, look in your mirrors and be ready to move out of the way. Be careful of animals at night, as they tend to cross the roads late evening to early morning.

Because you'll have a harder time spotting debris, your chance of puncturing a tire increases. If you have a tube tire you can install Slime in them right now and it will help prevent punctures. If you have the more common tubeless tire then carry a can of Fix-A-Flat. It should allow you to ride to a much safer place to fix the tire properly. Remember no matter what conditions you ride in only ride as fast as you can safely see what's ahead of you.

And again I want to remind you to invite that neighbor or friend that has a bike to come to our chapter meeting and see what fun we have.
