December 28, 2019 Ride - Submitted by John Conner

The planned ride was to meet up at the Versailles Kroger's at 9:00am and ride to Beattyville, Pittsburg, Corbin, and Somerset. The route would take us on Highway 52, a particularly fun and twisty piece of road from Richmond to Beattyville. Then we would travel south-west in the Daniel Boone National Forest to Pittsburg (chosen because I once lived in Pittsburgh, PA), and then to the Sonny's BBQ in Corbin, for lunch. After lunch we would head out to Somerset to pick up Hwy 27 for the return ride back to Versailles.

The ride to Versailles started about 8:30 and it was still rather foggy. Jeff and Jim met me at the Versailles Kroger's about 8:50. Jim was just pulling away from the pumps when I got there and Jeff was still fueling. I pulled in and topped off the tank. We visited in the parking lot while we waited for others to join and commented on the fog. About 9:10 we decided to go to McDonald's and have a cup of coffee while the fog burned off.

We left McDonald's at 10:00am with blue sky starting to emerge from the rapidly dissipating fog. We found our way to Man -O-War Blvd and turned right onto HWY 25 at the CarMax in Lexington. During this short part of the ride we discovered CB communications were less than optimal. Jim's portable CB provided only a screeching noise, but he could hear me. Jeff could transmit just fine but he could not hear me. So we were reduced to the basics of follow the leader.

As we neared the I-75 on-ramp, I kept checking my mirrors to ensure we all made it through the light. Just as I entered the on-ramp, I realized Jeff, who was last in line, was nowhere to be seen. Jim and I pulled onto I-75 South and I kept the speed at about 60 mph so Jeff could catch up. He never did.

We exited at Clay's Ferry Road, Exit 99, our first available exit. We stopped on the off ramp and I tried several times to call Jeff, but never was able to get an answer. So we turned around and headed back to look for him. I kept checking the south-bound traffic to see if he went by but never did see him. We went all the way back to Exit 104 and back to the CarMax dealership before stopping again. I tried calling Jeff again and this time he answered.

There is a Speedway just before you get onto I-75 at Exit 104. Jeff's trike lost power and he coasted into there. After sitting for a few minutes, it started back up and ran fine so Jeff got back out and onto I-75 South, racing to catch up with us. He made is to the Exit 99 1-Mile sign and his engine died again. He coasted to a stop on the shoulder of the road. And that is where we found him after getting back onto the highway. Jeff made it to about ½ a mile from the exit that we had stopped at.

Jeff called Rescue Plus to arrange a tow. It was pretty noisy, standing there next to the highway so it took probably 20 minutes to get the call completed. We waited about 1 hour before the truck showed up. The driver was also a bike rider (H-D) so was sympathetic to our situation. While we got the trike loaded onto the flatbed, we discussed next steps.

The original route planned was no longer reasonable. We would be getting back at sunset or later. Jim also wanted to be home in time for the game at 3:00pm. We decided to ride to the Sonny's in Nicholasville while Jeff got his trike delivered. Jeff would join us as soon as he could.

Jim and I road north on Hwy 25, following the tow truck. We took a different route after we got back to Lexington and took several interesting back roads over to Sonny's. We got to the restaurant about 1:30pm and ordered. Jeff got there about 2:15 and ordered. We had a lot of good conversation over lunch and left there about 3:00pm. Jeff drove home while Jim and I took 168 route through Keene to get back to Versailles. I departed Jim's company when we got to the Bluegrass Parkway. After a short run to the Lawrenceburg exit, I took the 10-mile ride north on 127 to my place, arriving home about 4:00pm.

This ride had some significant twists and we never did achieve the planned goal of enjoying some twisty roads in the Daniel Boone Forest. But we did achieve near maximum camaraderie. And we did spend most of the day on the bikes. A Win-Win for me.

Polar Bear Ride, 1/1/202 – Submitted by Lynn Tucker
