Gripes and Likes of the 2021 Goldwing DCT from a New Owner—Submitted by Frank Hardy

From the moment I first saw the 2018 Goldwing I knew I had to have one until I walked to the rear of it and saw the reduction of storage space from models preceding it. I knew then I could live without it...unless or until Honda corrected this blunder if they wanted to continue to call it a "touring bike." Dreams dashed! Then in January when Honda released all the changes to the '21 Goldwing after listening to customer complaints I had the dream revived. Thus, on February 9, I paid a deposit on my future wing with M&E Honda in Bedford, Indiana. They were the only dealership in a four state area to have a couple in stock that they just received, one black and one red and black (the only colors available). I chose the red and black one. They were very accommodating and agreed to hold the bike for me until February 27 due to all the terrible weather in progress and forecasted to come. Finally the day arrived and the weather was still iffy but John Conner graciously not only offered the use of his enclosed bike trailer he drove to Bedford with the trailer, loaded and tied down the bike and delivered it to my home in Winchester. Alan Earnest was also along and you can only imagine the tales that were told among the three of us. It was a nice drive up and back, lots of laughs and countryside to see.

Alan's new Goldwing had been in his garage for over a month without him having ridden it since he got it. So, on the second day of March and my having never ridden my bike either since it was delivered, we finally hit the road for the first time. We were joined by Roger Early for the inaugural ride for both Alan and me. We rode south to Clay City by the back roads, east over the mountains and then north to Mount Sterling, from there on US 60 to Winchester and then north to Paris to Alan's home where we discussed what we learned about the bikes.



Likes: First of all, I felt like I was getting out of a Cessna 150 and getting into a F-15 fighter. Goodness, this thing is so different than anything I had ever ridden. It is buttery smooth; the DCT transmission is a joy to use; has more power than I'll ever use; gets great gas mileage; the suspension soaks up the bumps like they aren't there, and it's quiet and comfortable. There are four different driving modes for any type of roads and conditions (the sport mode is like one Youtuber called "bat out of hell mode..he's not lying.) The capabilities of the electronics are almost limitless, and the brakes are outstanding as are the LED lights. With the electric windshield there is little to no wind to the upper torso but there is a little more wind on the legs and feet than on previous wings. Putting the bike on the center stand is easy peezy. Slow speed maneuvering in parking lots is going to require a little practice with the DCT but cornering is a breeze..simply amazing. Plus, it's a pretty nice looking bike.

Dislikes: Not too many, certainly not enough for me to take it back! As I stated, the electronics are a major upgrade and therein lies a problem of sorts, for me anyway. I'm fairly technically knowledgeable regarding today's tech stuff..at least I thought I was. Truthfully, the learning curve will be more than a little bit challenging than I thought. I'll be spending a good bit of time on the seat with the owner's manual in my hand. And then there's the navigation system..it has it's own manual by itself and it's thick. With time perhaps I'll at least learn the basics.

Storage is still a little lacking. The trunk has been enlarged so that now you can place two large helmets and a little more in them but the saddlebags are still too small compared to earlier Wings. As a solo rider I feel confident I can make a week or two trip with the onboard capacity plus a backseat travel bag. With a co-rider I would recommend a trailer or at least a hitch and travel rack if planning a long trip.

Mention of the trailer hitch brings me to a final gripe: the cost of accessories! Honda has fallen in love with themselves I think. Add-ons have reached the ridiculous as far as I can tell. For instance, if you would want a CB radio the cost is \$1250 plus installation well over \$300. For me, I think not and have purchased a Sena 50S instead. (don't tell Honda but I think it sounds better). Other aftermarket suppliers have raised pricing of many of the "want to get" items too. Have you looked at the price of a decent seat, trunk rack, trailer hitch, air control wings, foot pegs, etc. lately? I know I'll have to suck it up and dole out for some comfort foot pegs but chrome items will be a distant past. Oh, I forgot to mention the added lights (decorate or safety) is also out of sight. I won't even mention the cost of the bike itself.

All in all, I the likes far outdistance the dislikes and I plan on riding this bike for years. Find the right dealer and you can add 5 extra years of factory warranty for a very fair price..that's 8 years of worry free riding! If you're thinking about a new bike I wholeheartedly suggest you take a test ride. I think you'd be as amazed as I am.

Note from Roger Early:

Before we started the ride, I told Alan and Frank I was about 160 miles from hitting 90,000 miles on my 2008 Gold Wing. I bought it new in Richmond back in 2009. When I got back to my subdivision in Lexington, and less than a mile from home, the odometer rolled over to 90,000. Maybe this year I can add another digit to the odometer and hit 100,000!!

This month I would like to get back to the Levels program. The fourth level is known as **Level IV**: **Safety By Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness**. Level IV is the most prestigious of the REP levels and is referred to as Master Tour Rider/Co-Rider. It represents the highest commitment of the Rider and/or Co-Rider to safe riding and preparedness. This commitment is shown by a demonstrated history of safe miles and current certification in both First Aid and CPR. These Master Tour Riders and Co-Riders are the finest examples of the highest commitment to safe motorcycle operation and preparedness.

In past articles, I have discussed the meanings of commitment (Level I), and preparedness (Level III). Now let us investigate the meaning of enhanced. In the Meriam-Webster dictionary, we find the definition: to increase or improve in value, quality, desirability, or attractiveness. Enhance was originally formed from adding the prefix *in*to the Latin word *altus*, meaning "high", and evolved in Middle English to mean "to raise", not so much in a physical sense but more in a figurative sense.

We see examples of enhancement all around us, every day. With our motorcycles, we install safety chrome and lighting accessories to enhance the visibility and style. As individuals, we style our hair, choose our clothing, eat, and exercise, all in ways to make ourselves noticed, to enhance the way we are perceived, to be the best we can be. In our careers and in our hobbies, we constantly look for ways to be more efficient and accurate, to enhance our skills, to become the "master craftsman" of the task at hand.

Those who move on to Level IV are the "master craftsmen" of GWRRA. The Master Tour Riders and Co-Riders are shining examples to the rest of the membership. They are individuals who are caring, trained, and prepared, with the experience to back it up. They become ambassadors for the organization and examples for others to follow. To advance to Level IV, one must be current in Level III for one year and have taken both First Aid and CPR training, have 25,000 Safe Miles and must be committed to riding with "Proper Riding Gear" at all times. GWRRA provides special recognition to celebrate the Master Tour Rider/Co-Rider commitment each year at the District Rally and Wing Ding.

Level IV is the only level in the REP program that requires a one-time financial commitment of \$35.00 for each participant. For this you will receive a "Special Triangular" patch with dark blue border (a Black and Gold patch is available for an additional \$8.00 if you prefer) and your individual Master number embroidered on it, to further enhance your appearance to others.


