The Kentucky Blast is right around the corner! What is the Kentucky Blast? It is the annual Kentucky District Convention that will be held Thursday, August 19 through Saturday, August 21 in Lawrenceburg, KY. You can purchase a pass for the whole 3 days or a day pass if you can only go for one day. Our Chapter will be asked to volunteer to work at certain times, but I don't have the schedule yet. Thursday night will be a lot of fun! On Thursday, Aug. 19, at the Lawrenceburg Green, the band Puncheon Creek will be performing from 7-9 p.m. The Chuck Diesel food truck and Captain Frank's Hotdog Emporium food truck will be set up there from 6-9 p.m., as well as the downtown ice cream shop Caroline's Creamery. Bring a chair or blanket as there is no seating. The address is 44 Western Ave, Lawrenceburg, 40342.

On Friday and Saturday, the Blast will be at the American Legion Post – 725 W. Broadway, Lawrenceburg 40342. Just look for the flags! It's just down the street from the Dairy Queen. The hours are Friday 8-5 and Saturday 8-2. There will be indoor and outdoor vendors, games, and daily rides (register by 9:45am for kickstands up at 10am both days). Guided and self-guided rides are available and will be different each day. Concessions are available by the American Legion Ladies group. Friday night is a light parade at 9:30pm – register with Dan Bondurant by 4pm Friday. Closing ceremonies will be at 4pm on Saturday. The traveling plaque will be given away via ticket draw. Each Chapter in attendance will get one ticket in the drawing.

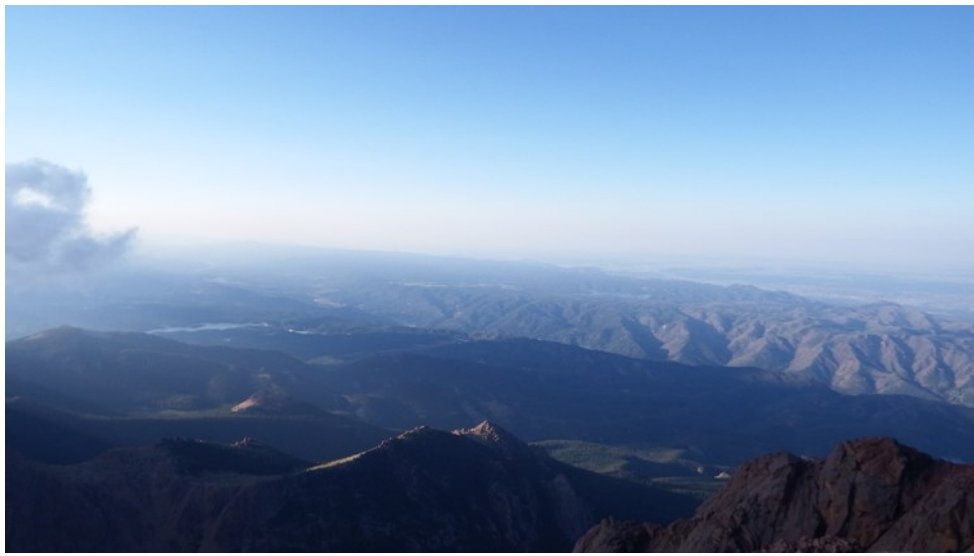
Wild West Tour 2021—Submitted by Michael VanHoose

Our first tourist attraction was Sioux Falls Park. Then on to the Corn Palace. The rocky trip continued in Kennebec, SD. We had checked in to our motel and I went to top off the gas tank for the next day. After filling up, I let out the clutch lever and watched it hit the ground. We couldn't find a clutch lever within 500 miles, so enter Road Rescue, Honda dealership in Chamberlain, SD and Julie and I in the back seat of the Hampton's very full SUV.

Our foursome enjoyed the Badlands, Mt. Rushmore, Deadwood, Aladdin, WY (population 15) and the Aladdin General Store, circa 1895. The only traffic problem we experienced was trying to get to Devil's Tower Visitors Center, so we passed it up and just enjoyed the landscape.

Beartooth Pass was still beautiful, even though we saw it from a car. I was sorely tempted to turn around and go again on the Chapter C Wild West Ride. Absolutely no waiting on June 25th to get into Yellowstone. We exited the east park entrance and spent the night at Pahaska Tepee, a hunting lodge built for Bill Cody in the early 1900s. We stayed in one of the original cabins with no TV, internet or A/C but had a pleasant night. Amenities include a nice restaurant, a complimentary tour of the old hunting lodge and a complimentary trail ride, which we declined.

The next day we headed back into the east entrance, again with no wait, and made it to Old Faithful about 10 minutes before the 5 minute show. Darrell was standing down wind and actually got to wear a geyser- a Geezer in a Geyser! Then on to the Buffalo Bill West Museum, where we spent several hours and did not see it all. The tickets are good for two days.

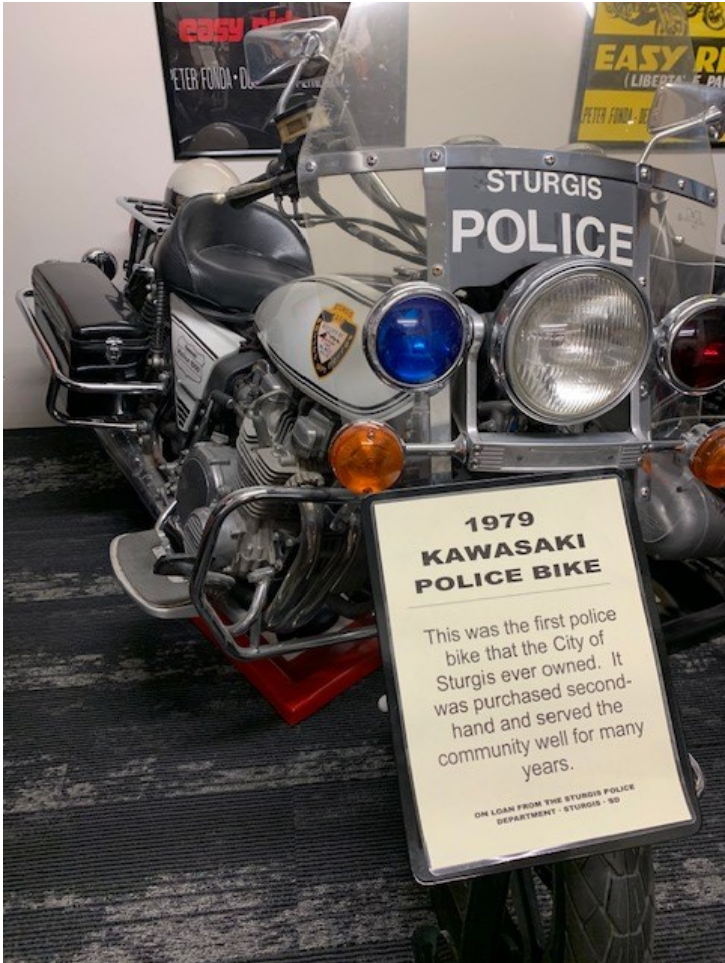
We got a little more Bill Cody the next day at the breakfast buffet at the Irma Hotel in Cody, which he built and named after his youngest daughter.

Belle Fourche, SD may not be a traditional stop but we really enjoyed it. John Wayne fans are familiar with the movie "The Cowboys," where the Duke hired little boys to drive his cattle to Belle Fourche. A dirty dog, played by Bruce Dern, shot the Duke in the back and killed him. The town shows the movie annually at a big outdoor screen behind the visitor center/museum. Belle Fourche is also near the geographical center of the United States.

After spending the day in Chamberlain, SD and visiting the Lakota Museum, we finally got the Wing back with new levers and a new mirror about 3 p.m.

The Hamptons wanted to take the express route and we wanted to try to see some of the sites from our original plan, so we parted. We landed in Hays, KS and went to Ft. Hays Historical Museum. Even there, we couldn't get away from Bill Cody and George Custer!

District Educator—Richard Artmayer

Happy August greetings to the members of the Kentucky District. Many of us are back from Wing Ding 42. I had a good time and I hope those of you that attended did too. Even though this was my 10th Wing Ding, I have often wondered about the people who say they are excited to see their old friends and make new ones every year. Now I know. Being a volunteer puts you in direct connection to other like-minded volunteer members. For example, I helped stage the parade, and met several of the Maryland District members who were also there. I also went to the Rider Educator's Forum and had the chance to greet in person many of the Educators I had only met on Zoom.

This month I want to relate some of the information I have learned from both Wing Ding and the July District Educators Zoom call. One of the people I was able to meet in person is Lorrie Thomas, Director of GWRRA University. In discussion, she explained that if we have a need for trainers, she has some that will travel. She also gave me a challenge; to put together an opportunity in our District to host the GWRRA 101 course. I am hoping that everyone will want to experience this opportunity to learn the facts and dispel the rumors of how and why we do what we do in GWRRA. I hope every Chapter Director will discuss this in their upcoming Gathering and send me a list of interested members by the middle of September. It would be helpful if there would be a recommendation of a venue as well. I would like to get this organized to be on the books by the middle of November, before the holiday crush.

The effects of the Pandemic are still causing some consternation with Members' status in the Levels program. While there are increasing numbers of opportunities to obtain the training one needs to stay current, many of these courses are out of our District. We are not the only District in this predicament. Because so many instructors have not had the opportunity to train (an instructor must be current in his achieved level to teach a Rider Ed course), they have become expired. For the Members, because of the difficulty of having to travel to find courses, the grace period has been extended one last time through June of 2022. So, if your Level status has expired after January 1, 2020, completing the necessary Rider Ed course will bring your status back to current, with no lapse of time. If you need an on-bike course and this is your normal year to need the full course (both classroom and range) this year you can take a range only class again to bring your status current.

I have also learned of the importance of having your medical and emergency contact information where someone on a group ride can find it. While some of us keep this information in a small tube in our left fairing pocket, others may not be comfortable with this personal information being available to anyone. For this reason, it is critical for a responsible member of the group to have a ride participation roster with emergency contact information on it. Any GWRRA group ride needs this roster to be made. Just because you wish it, does not mean that something is not going to happen on your ride. If something were to happen to you, how long do you want your loved ones to wait to find out? Why make the EMT have to guess what to do for your condition? It is also a good idea for someone on every official GWRRA group ride to have a GWRRA Accident/Incident Report form. Completing this form as soon as possible while all the details are fresh will help to protect everyone involved.

Hopefully, everyone knows they can check the Rider Ed data base to confirm their status in the Levels Program. If you do not, please contact me and I will send you the instructions, and/or call you and talk you through it. I will also be working to check the database each quarter and send a report to each Chapter listing the members who are expiring and need to retake one or more classes.
