
I made up for it by taking a solo pic of Alan in front of the restaurant. The highlight of the lunch was likely the coconut cream pie for dessert.

We backtracked to the ferry dock, taking the ferry across the Ohio river to Augusta, KY.


Again, we stayed on less traveled roads and into Cynthiana for fuel and a pit stop at McDonalds.

I hope everyone had a wonderful Easter. Now that the hard-boiled eggs, jellybeans, and marshmallow chicks have been delivered, Peter Rabbit will go from hopping down the bunny trail to hopping on his motorcycle and riding down the road. I suspect that, as the temperatures become more favorable, many of us will be doing the same.

As you finish the last of your candy, and start making your list of Spring chores, be sure to include the T-CLOCS list of checks for your motorcycle. In case you have forgotten:

- T Tires and Wheels
- C Controls
- L Lights and Electrics
- O Oil and Other Fluids
- C Chassis
- S Stands

The RPM Academy provides the R.17 form for those interested in tracking their bike's history, or just as a tangible method to be sure everything is covered. You can download the form at: https://rpmacademy.net/wp-content/uploads/2023/02/R.17-RPMA-Vehicle-Inspection-Form-01.31.23.pdf.

There are several other sources worth reviewing online. You can access them by typing T-CLOCS into your web browser.

There is one point of the T-CLOCS I would like to briefly discuss. This would be the letter L, for lights and electrics. When was the last time you actually looked at the bulbs responsible for keeping you safe? Sure, we all check for function, and true, I rarely ever see anyone with non-functioning lights on their motorcycle. But have you ever noticed some lights are more dim than others, even on the same model? Incandescent lamp filaments atomize over time and coat the inside of the glass bulb. How old are your bulbs? How many miles are on them? Unlike most cars (not including the DRLs), motorcycles run their lights the entire time the vehicle is in operation. This year, take the extra few minutes and open up your light assemblies and check those bulbs. I guarantee the bulb you replace today will last many times over the one you didn't.

Now that you have looked over your motorcycle, take the next step and look over you! In addition to T-CLOCS, there is also T-CARE. I introduced this acronym to Chapter G in the October 2015 Newsletter. In case this was missed:

- T Training
- C Conditioning
- A Attitude
- **R** Riding Risks
- **E Expectations**

T - Like any skill, the more it is practiced, the easier it is to perform. And taking a formal training allows your riding style to be checked for bad habits that could otherwise evolve into bad events.

C - As motorcycling is a physical sport, it is important to keep your body in good shape. Keep your body in good condition by staying active and getting annual check-ups. **A** - Attitude effects our action. Be in a good place when you start your ride, so you can be alert and aware of everything around you. Bad attitudes can cause distractions that can cause bad events. **R** - Everything in life has risk. Be sure to plan appropriately for the risks associated with motorcycling. Consider wearing all the gear all the time. **E** - Think about the ride before you start. A group ride on back roads is considerably different than a rush hour commute. Fun can be found in all rides if we set our expectations accordingly.
