Ride Coordinator Report

I want to thank the Chapter and Roger, for their confidence in me for my appointment to Ride Coordinator.

I like the committee model that was established last year. Right now, Frank, Mitch and I are on the committee. We need a couple of new members. If you are interested helping plan and lead rides for the Chapter please contact me. I expect we will meet sometime in February and brainstorm destinations. My goal is 2-3 rides per month, and a few impromptu rides when the weather is particularly nice, or when previous rides get rained out. I will be announcing the rides on primarily on Facebook, but I will send out a notice via email as well. It is easier for me if attendees RSVP for rides through the Facebook portal. I don't know about you, but I get about 70 emails a day, and sometimes things get lost in the clutter. My goal is to post the rides on the events section of our Facebook page so we keep track of upcoming rides without having to go through all our old emails. We will put the date, time and destination up initially, and then post the route as time permits.

Have you tried to figure out Basecamp? Me too. No joy. I found route planning software that I was able to figure out. It gives turn by turn directions, and is supported by Apple Car Play. The name of the software is Scenic. Right now, it is only available for Apple users, (Mac, iPhone and iPad) but an Android version is expected at some point in the future. I have been creating routes on my iPad. Scenic stores them in the cloud and I can then call up the route on my iPhone. I then use the phone as a GPS with turn by turn directions. Scenic has maps saved so you do not have to worry about cell service. It isn't free, but it is the easiest way I know of to plan and navigate a ride. If you have an interest, fool around with it and see if you like it. Routes are shareable (via email and Facebook) and can be converted to GPX.

The only ride we've had after last months newsletter was the ride for Cupcakes and Coffee after our meeting on October 21st. We started at Roosters and embarked upon a meandering route through Fayette and Woodford Counties, and ended up at Kristens Kreations and Amsden Coffee in Versailles. We had a great time viewing the Central Kentucky countryside. And the Cupcakes weren't bad either!

Don't forget about our Christmas party on December 5. Kickstands up at 6:30 at Roosters on Richmond Road.

I'll see you on the road.
